Children's Hospital and Daughters of Charity Collaborate in Pediatric Services

NEW ORLEANS - Children's Hospital and Daughters of Charity Health Centers (DCHC) recently signed a collaborative agreement to work together to expand primary pediatric healthcare in the New Orleans area. On November 17, Children's Hospital's Kids First Prytania Clinic will transition to a Daughters of Charity Pediatric Clinic.

An integral part of the New Orleans healthcare community for 180 years, DCHC is committed to providing high-quality, comprehensive healthcare to adults and children, regardless of their ability to pay, DCHC President & CEO Michael G. Griffin said.

"Daughters of Charity Health Centers is happy to welcome you and your child to our family," Griffin said. "The name has changed but the doctors and quality of care that you have come to expect will remain the same."

With the addition of the Daughters of Charity Pediatric Clinic on Prytania, community members will now have access to six Daughters of Charity Health Centers throughout the metropolitan area, providing convenient and affordable access to primary care, pediatric care, pharmacy services, behavioral health, dental, eye care, WIC, prenatal care and Medicaid enrollment. Kids First Prytania patients can expect the same exemplary services as offered in our other locations in the Bywater, Carrollton, Gentilly, eastern New Orleans and Metairie. Daughters of Charity Pediatric Clinic hours of operation are from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. DCHC accepts most private insurance, Medicaid and Medicare. Financial assistance is available, as well as low-cost medications through the pharmacy assistance program.

DCHC will assume responsibility for three additional Kids First Clinics over the next six weeks culminating with the Kids First Mid-City clinic, which will be relocated to the Daughters of Charity Health Center at 3201 South Carrollton Ave on December 22.

"We are extremely pleased with the strong working relationship that has developed with the Daughters of Charity Health Centers," said Mary Perrin, president & CEO of Children's Hospital. "Providing quality healthcare to our children remains our top priority, and DCHC shares that commitment."

Griffin added, "We will incorporate these pediatric locations into the same nationally recognized and awarded patient centered models of care we are providing at our other five locations."
